APPLICATION FAQs

Basic Information:

Why is DCF offering this program? The objectives of the program are to increase the numbers of graduate level supervisors in the Depatment of Children and Families (DCF) and to expand the professional skill levels of its work force. The program also aims to stabilize Distribution by retaining quality staff. DCF hopes to enable staffwith a strong commitment to New Jersey's vulnerab children and families to obtain their MSW and to contribute to the continual improvement of the state's public child welfare system. This program provides opportunities for supervisors, in particular casework supervisors, to broaden their perspectives on social work and child welfare, develop advanced clinical skills and enhance their supervisory skills.

<u>Please note that students admitted to the program must attend all scheduled classes, even if they occur on a state holiday. Students do not receive comp time for attending classes.</u>

What does the program cost me? If you are admitted to MCWEPDCFwill pay all tuition and fees. Your responsibilities include books, transportation or parking costs to get to class or to the library, as well as time and effort to prepare for and attend classes. We also expect you to participate in any evaluative activities associated with the program.

How does the commitment to give back to DCFwork? Upon graduation, MCWEP graduateer equired to to repay DCF or all

___ educational costs incurred on your behalf dring the time you were a student.

What if I have a pending disciplinary action? Am I still eligible to apply? Applicants must be, and remain in, good standing with the Department of Children and and the event of a disciplinary action, the situation in question will be reviewed and it is possible that you will no longer be eligible to participate in the program.

What if I am not able to finish the MSW degree? If you drop out of the program before complete the degree, you will need to repay **D**F for all educational costs incurred toward the degree.

What if I need to take a leave from my job for health, family or other reasons? You will be required to take a leave from the program, as DCF is able to support your education during your leave. You must discuss your situation with MCWEPand your faculty advisor at the university, who can help you plan. Enrollment in the program is a serious commitment, and students should consider their abilito make a commitment to study for the duration of the program before accepting admission and during the application process. The program concentrations are designed in such a way to enable you to continue your employee while pursuing a degree, but are tight and missing part of the program can delay you make the program.

Preparing to apply:

How do I apply for the Master Child Welfare Education Program: The application process consists of submitting all materials required (see the application check list) including btaining required signatures of approval. Af.a taining require

How can I best prepare myself to apply to the Master Child Welfare Education program? The best preparation is to spendsome time thinking about your goals and expectations and to consider how graduate education can fit into your present life. Ask yourself the following questions:

- x Do I want a career in child welfare?
- x Am I ready for graduate school?
- x How will I balance my work, personal life and graduate study?
- x Do family members and other important people in my life support my plans?
- x Do I have the support of my workplace?
- x What do I want to get out of an MSW degree?

Request transcriptsight away; they sometimestake time. Talk to your supervisor about your intentions. Make sure you address all the questions in the plication. Write clearly and proofread what you have written, for spelling, grammar clarity, completeness. Submit a complete application before the deadline to the held Welfare Education Institute at Stockton University

I did not do so well in undergrad. Will this affect my application? Admission to graduate school generally requires a GPA of 3.0. The participating schools social Work will consider other aspects of an application that suggest that an applicant has potential to do well in graduate school. For example, your transcripts will be examined to assess whether grades improved during the undergraduate years, or if the applicant did well in courses relevant to human services, ex if an overall GPA is below 3.0. Is any graduate level courses the applicant has taken, on a matriculate or normatriculate basis andwork experience will be taken into account. The narrative and recommendation letters are looked at closely to assess the applicant's academic and professional potential.

Which Rutgers MSW programs can I apply to? MCWEP applicants are eligible for enrollment in the Intensive Weekend program.MCWEP applicants are in egible for the On Campus Program, 100% Online Program or Blended Online program.

Do I get to choose which MSW program I attend?

No. While applicants do indicate which programs they would like to attend most, there is no guarantee that they will be admitted or assigned to their top choice. Each schoollhave approximately 5 students, so factors such geography and equitable distribution will ale impact which MSW program students attend.

Will I find out if I was accepted at all the schools to which I applied?

No, you will only be informed of which scbol you have been assigned to as part of your participation in MCWEP.

Applicants with Graduate Social Work Credits:

I have taken Professional Credit Courses (PCC) at Rutgers School of Social Work. How does that affect my application? Successful completion of PCC coues can help your application. This demonstrates to some degree that you are aboto handle graduate level work.

Do those PCCcredits count toward my degree? If admitted into the program, each individual school will review your transcripts and credits earnedthat may count towards your degree.

I have MSW credits from another coll ege/university. Do they count toward my degree? Each school will review your transcript and any credits from another accredited Social Work program mabe transferred and applied to your degree.

Applicants with Other Graduate and Certificate Credits:

I have graduate credits (or a graduate level deg ree) from another college/university in another field. Will these credits count toward my degree? Your transcript will be reviewed and it may be necessary to look at course descriptions. Credits from degree programs that are parallel to social work canften be applied to the degree. This usually concerns electives; in some instances, credits can replace aimed course, but this is less usual. The individual schoolill determine which credits may be transferred for credit in the program.

I received a certificate for courses related to child welfare. Can they be counted toward my degree? No. Only graduate credits can be considered for credit towards an MSW degree. However, do provide transcripts for any course work you have completed at a dege/university. They can help assess your potential as a student, and strengthen your application.

Applic ants with a BSW:

I have a BSW. How does this affect my application and graduate education? Applicants with a BSW from an accredited college or University can be considered for admission with Advanced Stiang. Consideration for Advanced Standing depends pon when the degree was received, overall GPA, and grades of B or better in all social work and field education courses. BSW applicants go though the same application and interview process as other apticants.
