

Although fewer cars were on the main highways during the the of the shutdown, an umber of drivers were killed in car accidents. Officials announced in February 2019 that irresponsible driving led to an increase of 5% in fatal crashes across New Jersey compared to the prives ar (Daily Voice). The trend for fatalities can also be seen on an ational level, leading to an increase 630% despite having significantly fewer drivers on theoads (Daily Voice). This trend has concerned many individuals and the state of Division of ighway Traffic Safety has launched several social media campaigns and other awareness tools to bring attention its theof reckless driving. Pam Shadel, a Governor's Safety Association senior director, reported in an interview in May 2020 that law enforcement has reported many cases of heavy speeding across New
