## Riley's seat in 3rd Legislative District up for grabs, Stockton poll shows

Republicans are competing to take a seat in the 3rd Legislative District, while Senate President Stephen Sweeney ~~seeks~~ ~~to~~ ~~take~~ ~~fairly~~ his seat, according to a poll released Thursday ~~note~~ by the William J. Hughes Center for Public Policy at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey.

In the Stockton/Zogby poll of the district commissioned by the center, incumbent Democratic Assemblywoman Celeste Riley has just under 38 percent of those polled, while the Republican challengers D4(c)-11(u)-65.3(e)-17(c)-112(912.2w8(l)55-)6.4(D)(b)-112(912.55-) poll.

Riley's figures have slipped some 6 percentage points since a similar Stockton/Zogby poll in September. At the same time, ~~and~~ DeCic Villare's figures have risen 5.2 and 6.6 percentage points, respectively. DeCicco is an incumbent Republican legislator, who was redistricted from the 4th into the 3rd district after a surprise win in 2009. Villare lost to Riley by 1,021 votes that year.

Democratic Assemblyman John Burzichelli leads the pack in that district, with more than 42 percent of those polled. ~~With~~ ~~an~~ ~~more~~ 12-point lead, Sweeney, with more than 46 percent retained a comfortable lead over his Republican challenger Michael Malligan in district's state Senate race, the poll reported. The 3rd District includes Salem and parts of Gloucester and Cumberland Countie
