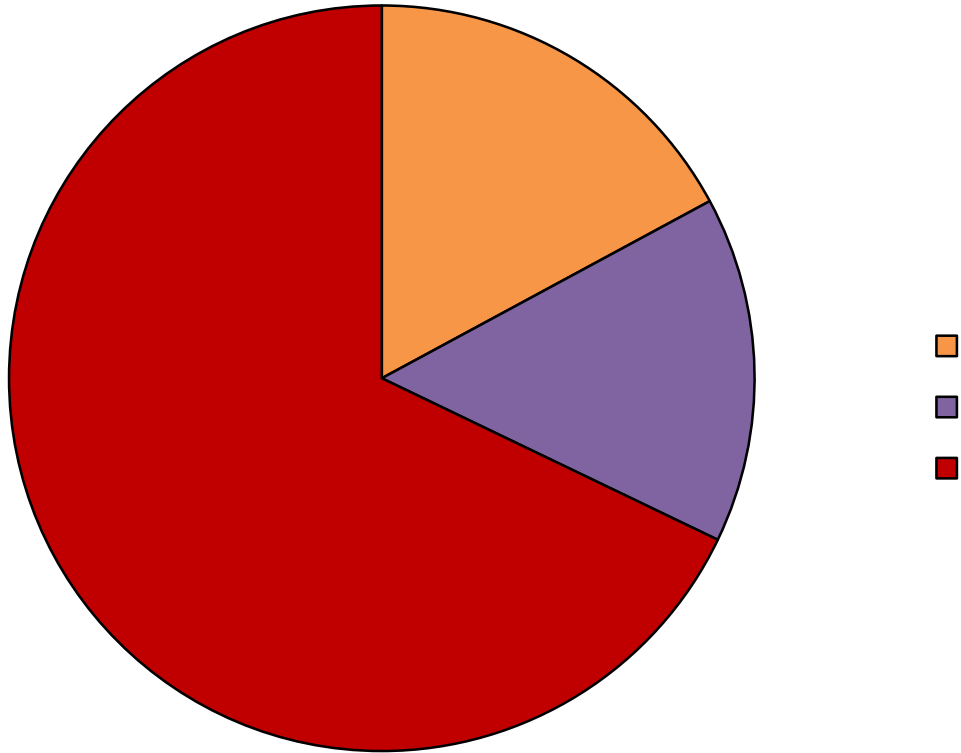


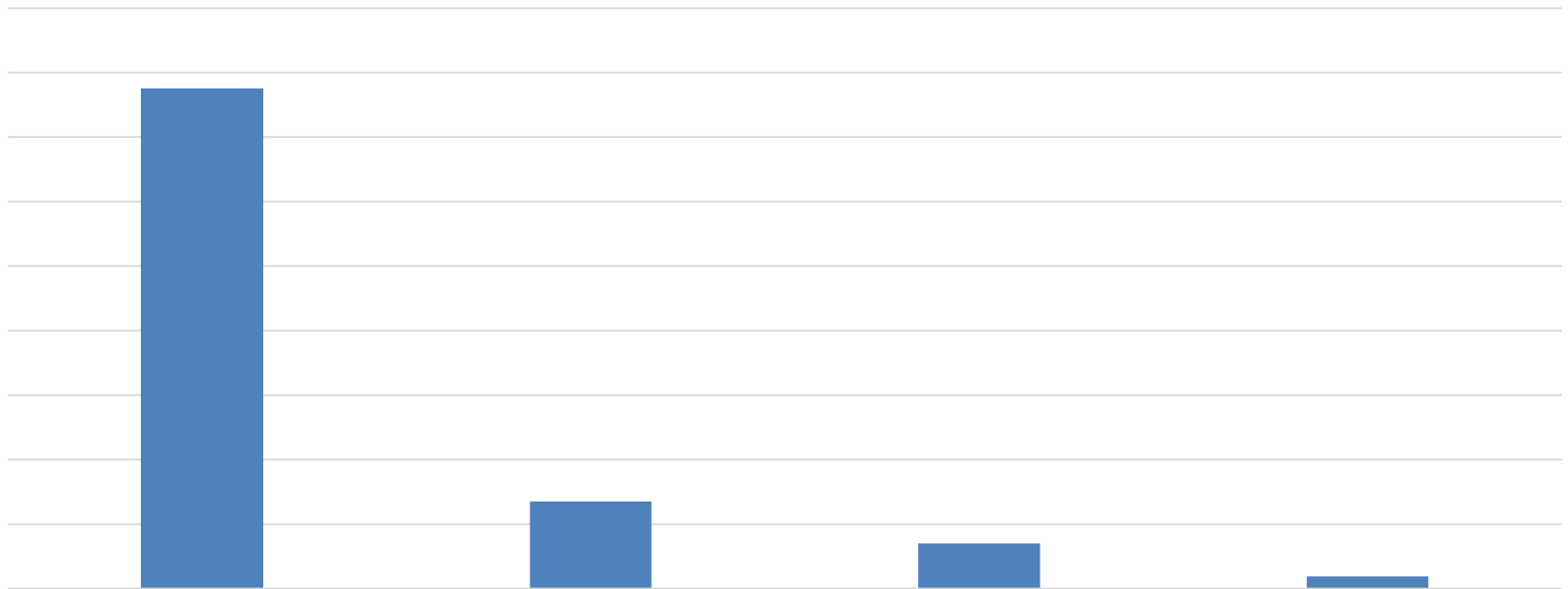


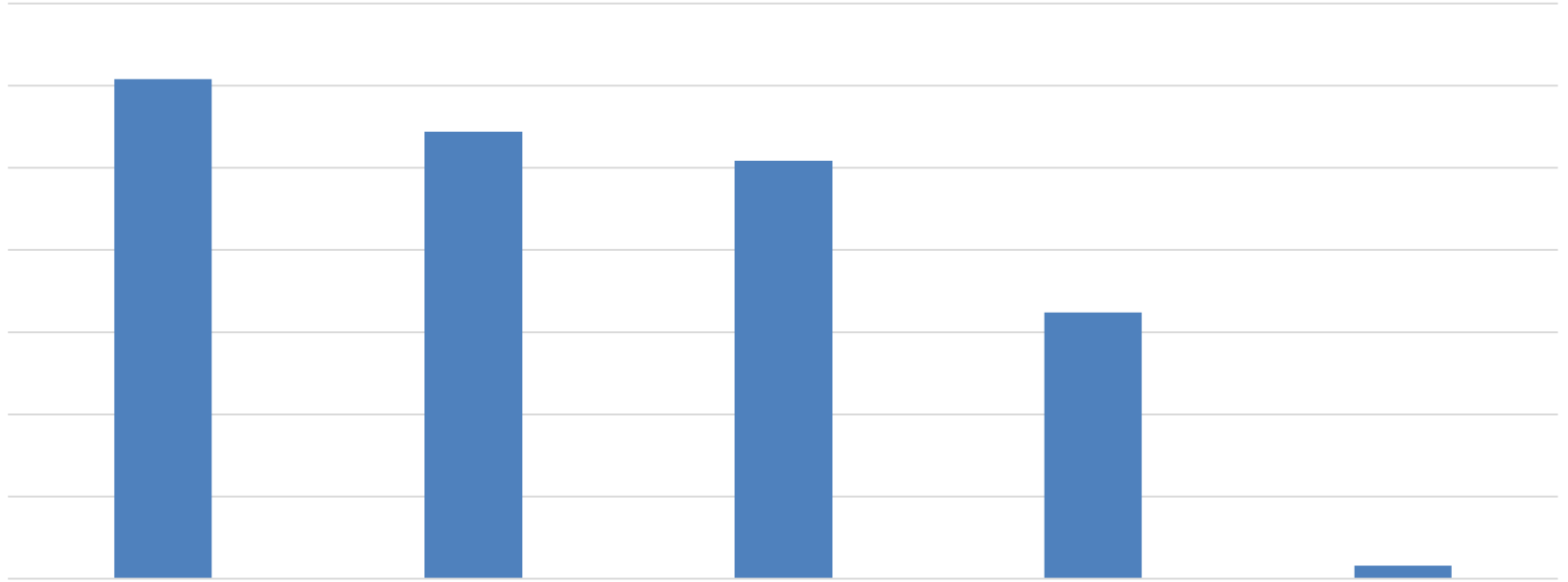


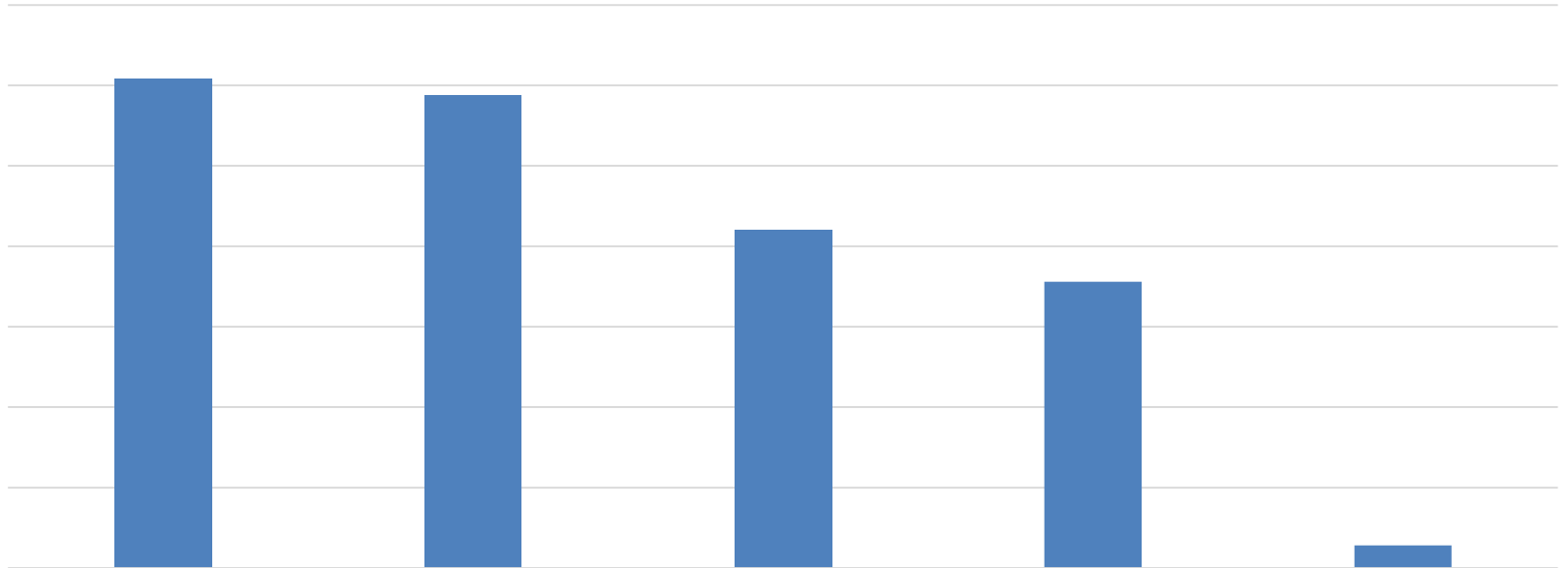


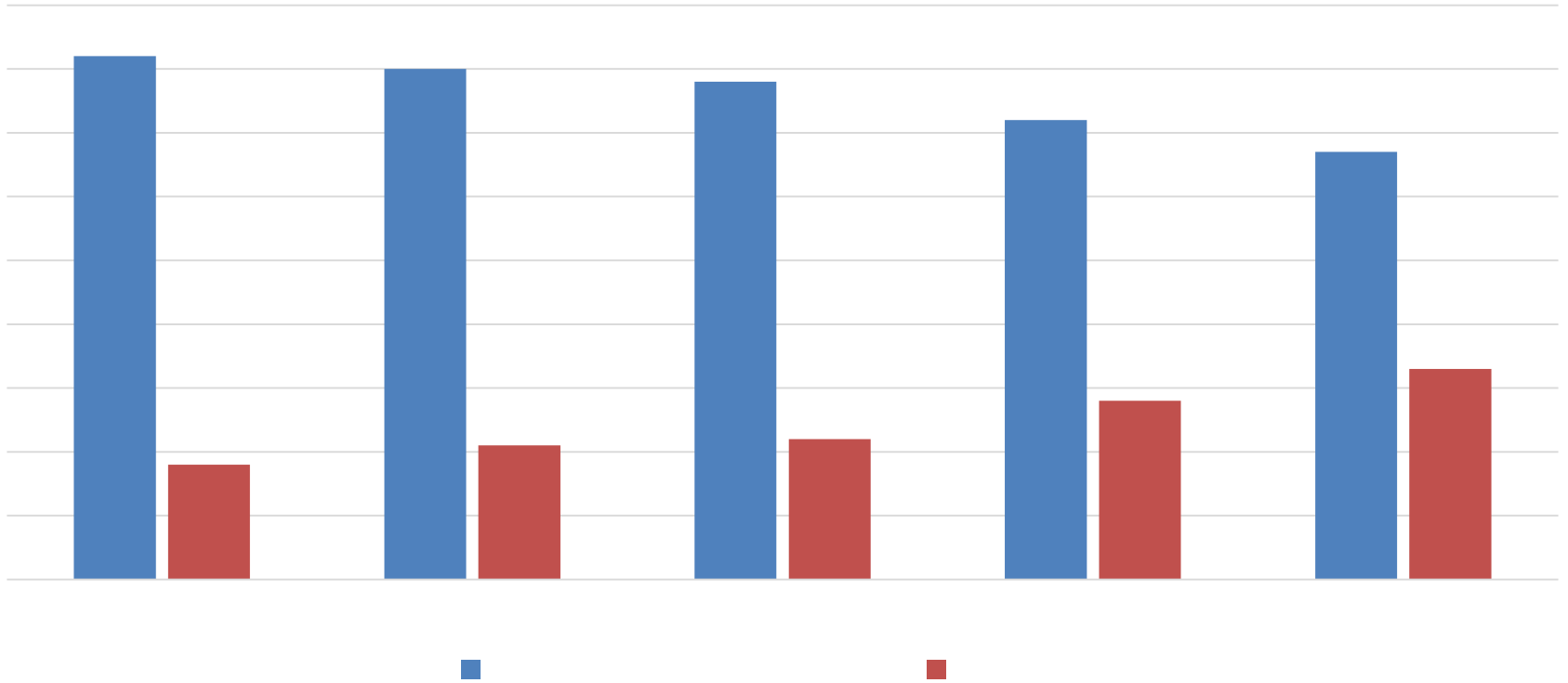


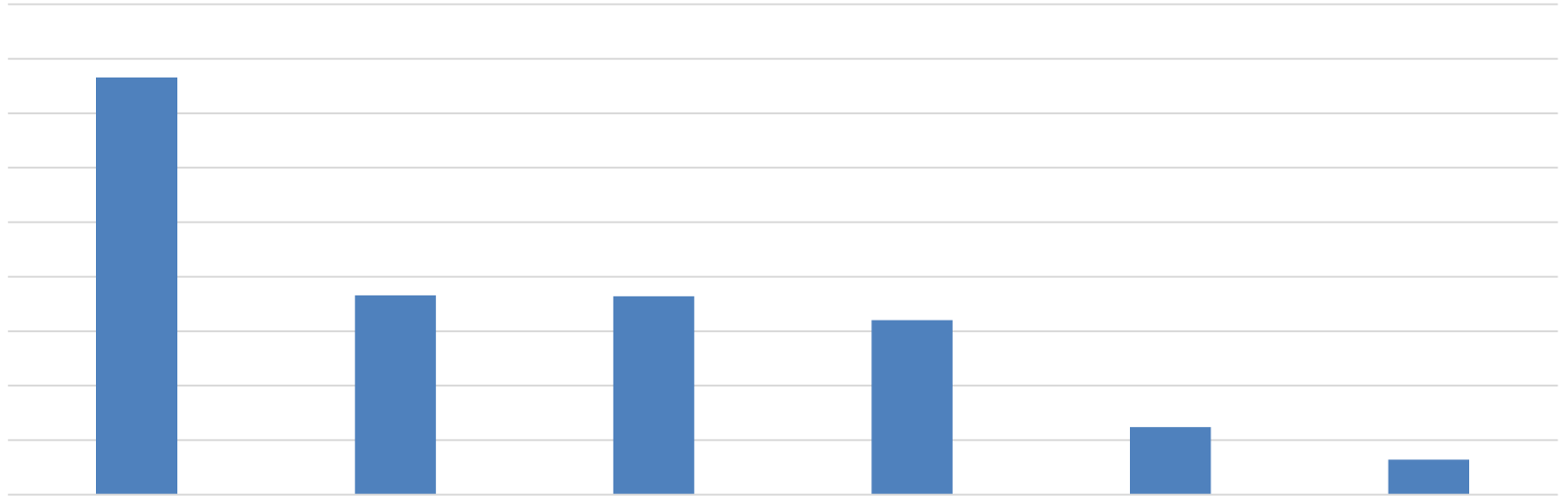


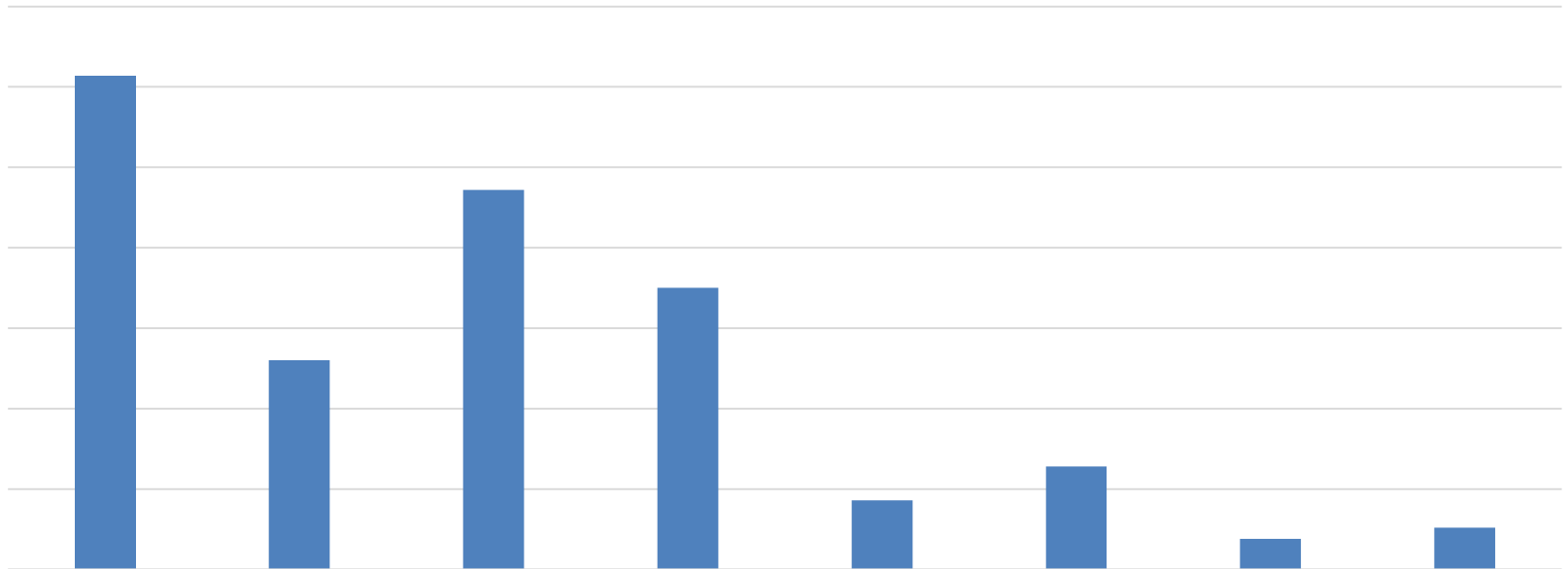










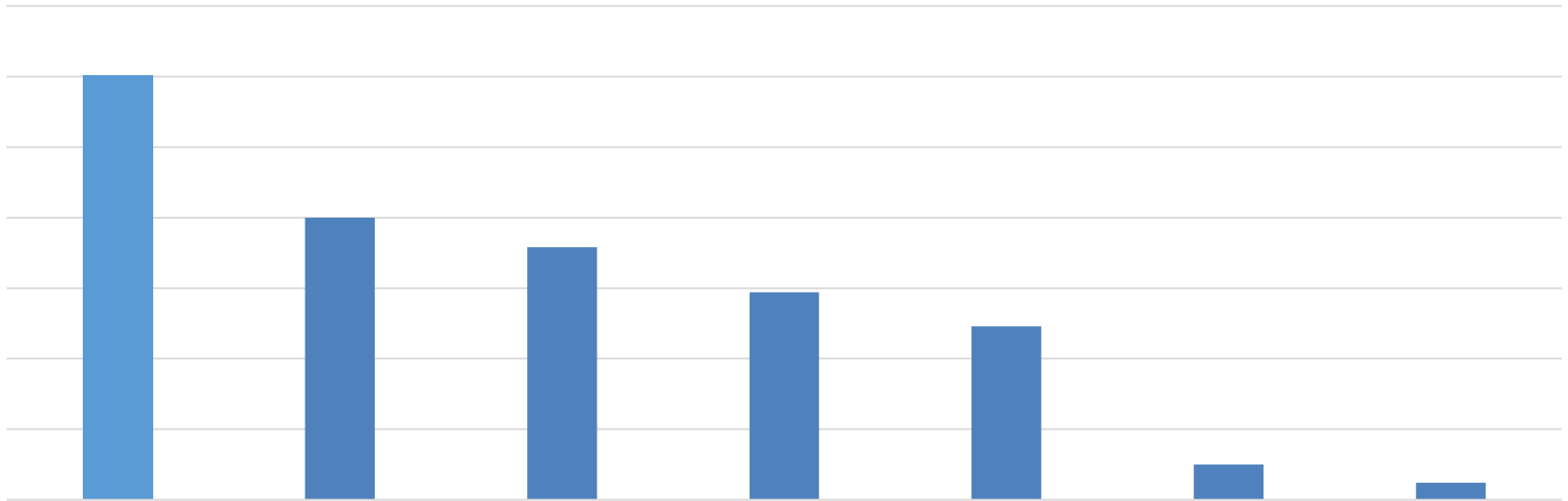


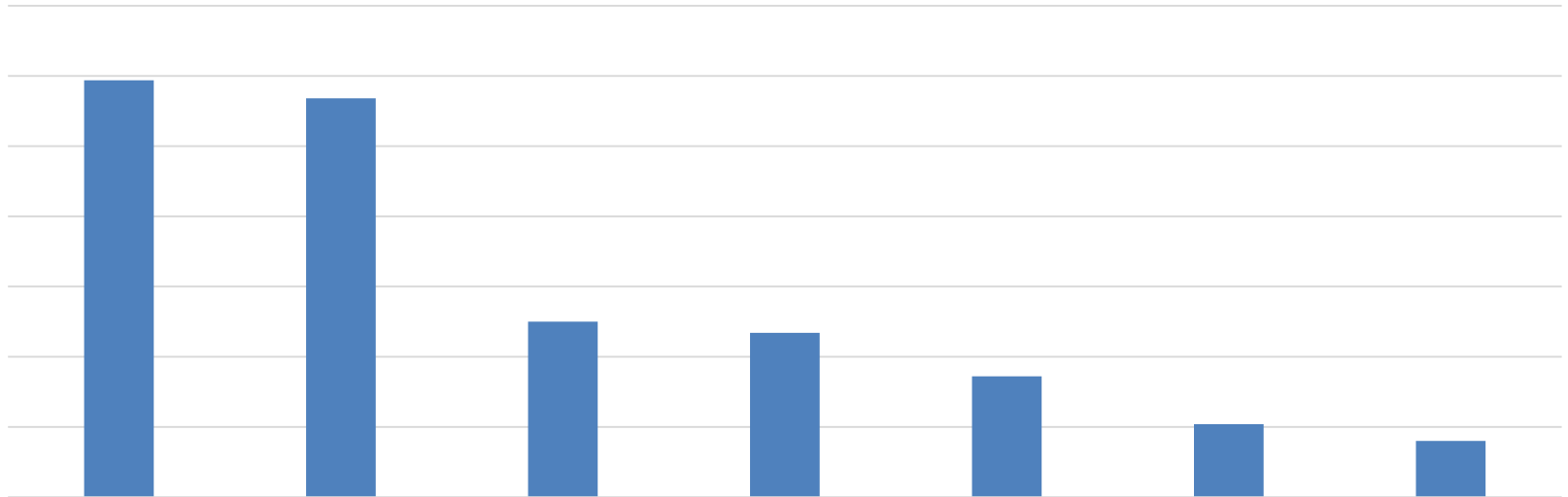
N.J. Colleges and Universities are highly valued, **but** need to change:

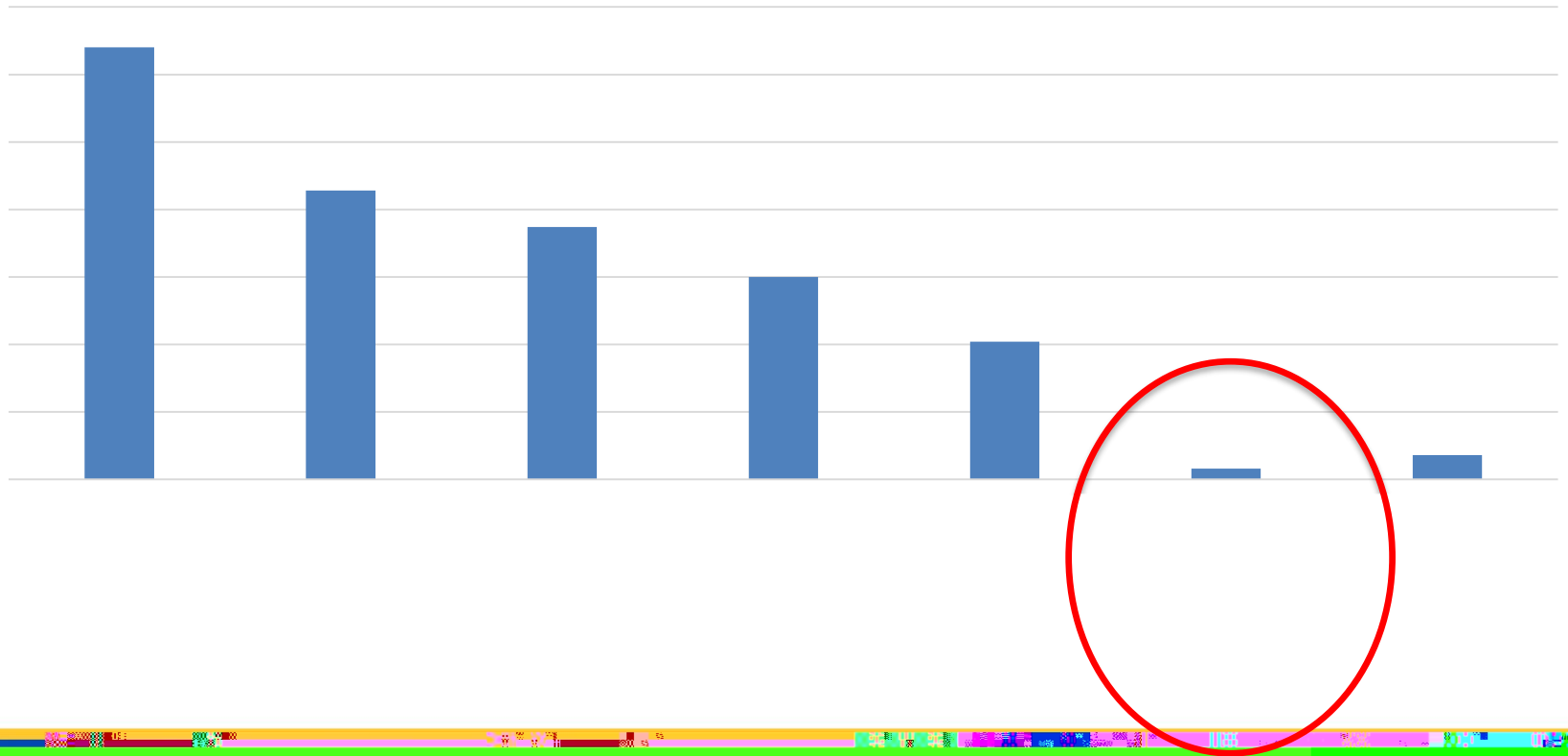
To meet the needs of a changing student population, with changing expectations about the purposes of college

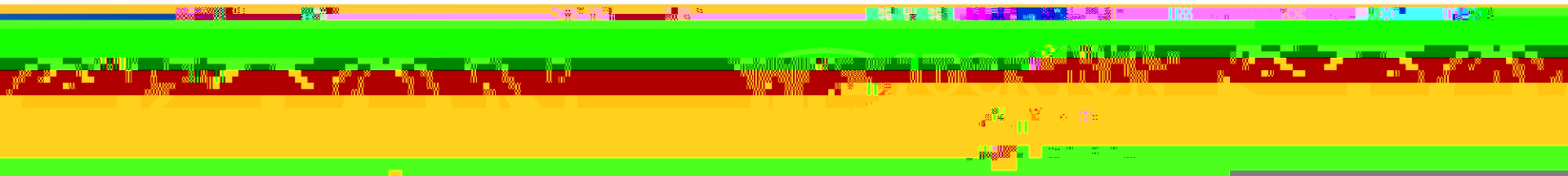
