In a recent peech, former re ident Obama lamented what he called the "cancel culture on college campu e, meaning tudent being o fixed in a political polition that they purpo efully identify a weak oppoling view of other to knock down, thereby u tifying their own. But effective civic participation mean more than tolerance of other point of view.

## Requirin a hi her level f di c ur e

Civic engagement re uire a higher level of di cour e that i outcome -ba ed, con idering prioritie, ri k, benefit and con e uence of acout

tructure and function of governance that allow individual to practice citizen hip a a mean of "ecuring the ble ing of liberty.

Educating and creating better citizen re uire at it root deeper under tanding of our democratic tructure, the Con titution, the three branche of government, how they work, and the role of citizen in maintaining, protecting and reforming them where they live.

## At the center fc lle e learnin

Accordingly, the goal of civic participation hould be at the center of college learning, not on the periphery. It is not omething to be left to the political cience or his tory department. Basic principle of civic participation can be engaged across the curriculum, whether the humanities, ciences or art. To argue that such integration would politicize the academy should be anticipated, but should not be accepted a mean of deflection from what need to be accomplished.

Thi i a good time for college pre ident to be bold, not timid, about leading on civic learning.

Here i what they can do:

- Take more ri k; don't play it afe. Actively plan to peak publicly on important contemporary policy i ue, tied to the meaning to citizen hip. Tell tru tee, the faculty, elected official and other what they plan to talk about in advance, and do it. romote the politive cone uence of informed and active citizen hip, linked to democratic outcome and the common good;
- Make civic learning mi ion-centered, to provide a deeper under tanding of how civic participation upport taking legitimate action in a democracy. Integrate civic learning acro the curriculum. Every academic di cipline i affected by local, tate and federal entitie that e tabli h, admini ter or interpret law and regulation ba ed on con titutional principle. Civic learning and participation can be examined acro the univer ity, through reading, writing, art, re earch, imulation and field experience, without wandering into parti an political territory.

• Build tronger partner hip with chool and organization that promote civic learning and invite practitioner to the camput to upport the faculty and to hare fir thand knowledge with tudent about how government work, and it effect on their live.

Many people have re pon ibility for leading in a democracy. It take citizen who are informed about civic tructure and function to make democracy work in practice. Thi need to be a higher priority for college. Thi i where college pre ident can lead.
