Atlantic Club back on the market - According to ThePress of Atlantic City, R&R Development Group, LLC, has backed out of its

State Privatizes City Trash Collection - According to [The Press of Atlantic City](#), on May 15 state officials authorized a three-year, \$7.2 million contract to outsource Atlantic City's trash and recycling collections. City administration officials claim that the contract will save the city \$1.1 million per year without requiring layoffs. Representatives of City Council have questioned the administration's savings calculations and take issue with the state bypassing City Council's vote.
