Coverage Any individual, including but not limited to University student, visiting faculty member or other visitor, guest, professional member of the University's academic, administrative, or teaching staff, or otherwersity officer, agent or employee, corpticen, company, partnership, firm, association, with whom the University on tracts or political subdivision or other individual or corporation coming onto the Universitycampus becomes subject to the requirements of the Public Stormwater General Permit issued by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection which includes provisions fathe Pollution Prevention Policy, \alla1 which is the basis fothis procedure

Definitions For the purpose of this rocedure the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meanings stated hereless their use in the text of this regulation clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the

- a. <u>Litter</u> Any used or unconsumed substance or waste material which has been discarded, whether made of aluminum, glass, plastic, rubber, pape or other natural or synthetic material, or any combination thereof, including, but not limited to, any bottle, jar or can, or any top, cap or detachable tab of any bottle, jar or can, any unlighted cigarette, cigar, match or any flaming or glowing mater or any garbage, trash, refuse, debris, rubbish, grass clippings or othe lawn or garden waste, newspapers, magazines, glass, metal, plastic of paper containers or other packaging or construction material, but does not include the waste of the primary processes of mining or other extraction processes, logging, sawmilling, farming or manufacturing.
- b. Litter Receptacle A container suitable for the depositing of litter.
- c. <u>Person</u>— Any individual (including but not limited to a University student, visiting faulty member or other visitor, guest, professional member of the University academic, administrative or teaching staff, or other Universityofficer, agent or employee), corporation, company, partnership, firm, association, or political subdivision of this State whose conduct on Universityroperty is subject to regulation by the University
- d. <u>University</u>-Stockton University
- e. <u>University Property</u> Lands and buildings owned or controlled by Stockton University.

Prohibited Conduct

- a. No person shall throw, dropiscard, abandon or otherwise place any litter or debris of any nature upon University operty other than in a litter receptacle
- b. Whenever any litter is thrown or discarded or allowed to fallta5tontro
