Preservation Assistance Grants for Small Institutions are being offered by the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH), Division of Preservation and Access.

The NEH is seeking applications from small institutions such as libraries, museums, historical societies, archival repositories, cultural organizations, town and county recorder offices, and colleges and universities to improve their ability to preserve and care for their significant historical collections.
